

THE SOPOS COALITION is a multidisciplinary group that grew out of the publication of the SOPOS Report, "Shut Out, Priced Out and Segregated: The Need for Fair Housing for People with Disabilities."* The Coalition includes architects, developers, builders, lenders, professors, attorneys, disability advocates, government agencies, nonprofits, and other individuals and organizations. The Coalition currently works to create more accessible, affordable and integrated housing for Georgians regardless of age or ability by advocating for:

- 1. Enhancing opportunities for the education of architects, designers, real estate agents, developers and builders of single and multifamily housing.
- Increasing availability of Low-Income Housing Tax Credit properties to people with disabilities who have very low incomes (below 30 percent of AMI).
- 3. Ensuring local zoning codes allow for a wide range of housing types and include basic access features in all homes (visitability).
- 4. Providing support services for those people with disabilities who need them in order to live in the community (and not in an institution).
